If, the answer is yes to any of the above questions, I am available to work with you to create and grow a Legacy Society in your congregation. I have worked for some 20 years in the area of Stewardship and Planned Giving.

Saint Thomas' All Saints Legacy Society

I have created a St. Thomas' All Saints Legacy Society that now has some 29 Individual /and Couples as members who have named St. Thomas' in their Estate Plans. All have joined the Legacy Society. St. Thomas has 29 members the Diocese of Maryland's Legacy Society out of 91 Members.

Diocese of Maryland

I have chaired the Diocese of Maryland's Planned Giving Committee and am now a member of the Diocese of Maryland's Task Force on Planned Giving.

I have spoken at our Diocese of Maryland Convention and made a major presentation to our convention on end of life issues, including in that presentation our Diocesan Legacy Society.

I have planned a Legacy Society Workshop in the Diocese of Maryland, at St. Thomas' in which many Congregations attended to learn how to develop and grow a Legacy Society.
